

Our goals for this innovative program are having campers benefit from the development of their equestrian skills, enhance knowledge of equine care, barn management and building a relationship between horse and rider; becoming a more intimate team working together as one. We provide endless opportunities to improve skill sets and gain knowledge while also creating a fun camp experience. As you embark on your Blue Star Equestrian Camp adventure, know that you can rely on our dedicated riding instructors and counselors to be there for you every step (be it a trot or canter) of the way!





Program Focus

The primary focus of the Horseback Skills Camp is fun and safe riding and horsemanship. Many of today's life lessons are learned by working with and riding horses. Campers will be able to demonstrate effective communication skills with the horse and other riders, responsibility for taking care of the horse s/he loves and a commitment to doing the best you can do for the horse and yourself.

What to Expect

Each camper will be assigned his/her "own" horse for the course of the camp (horse and rider appropriately suited). Working together, the camper and horse will become a team by concentrating on the skills of riding. The rider will also be encouraged to understand what his/her horse is thinking and feeling. The goal is to better understand and communicate with your mount, so that both horse and rider enjoy their riding time together.

In addition to the excitement of riding a horse of his/her "own", the camper will learn the responsibility and work involved with properly caring for a horse. After each morning lesson, the campers will exhibit the proper care of his/her horse including un-tacking, bathing, grooming and stabling.







Riding Assessment and Instruction

Campers will be grouped according to age and experience so as to offer the most fine-tuned and highest quality riding instruction. Our instructor to camper ratio is never more than 3:1.

Does my child have to have previous riding experience?

NO! Our beginner group will consist of campers who have no or very little experience or who have only progressed to the trot. Beginner riders will concentrate on learning the correct position and skills necessary to be a balanced and secure rider and advanced beginners will work towards cantering and small fences.

Novice riders are comfortable with the walk, trot and canter and have not jumped or have jumped very small fences. Riders will improve their basic riding skills and will concentrate on cantering, performing school movements and jumping basics.

Intermediate riders are comfortable with walk, trot and canter and jumping the appropriate level of fences.

Instruction will continue to be tailored to each individual rider so as to build on the rider's skills and adding the finer point of riding. Advanced riders are those comfortable with the walk, trot, canter and jumping courses. Instruction will continue on hows and whys of riding including but not limited to flying changes, jumping, turns and courses.

Program Focus

Horsemanship, Barn Management and Horse Care

Safety around horses, how to handle a horse, and the learning of colors, markings and breeds will be important aspects of the rider's program. It is our goal for our campers to create a natural bond with their horse and gain a basic understanding of how horses think. Additionally, skills learned will include correct leading, grooming, haltering, saddling, braiding, bathing, stall cleaning and feeding.

Trail Ride

Campers will participate in a daily afternoon trail ride, which will reinforce the daily lessons learned. Each ride will consist of a new trail that will suit the rider's ability.

Mini Horseshow

All campers will participate in an on-site horseshow that will showcase each rider's abilities and riding skills. Parents are absolutely welcome to attend. This culminating event on Saturday, will showcase each individual's abilities and riding skills, focusing on his/her progress and achievements.





All activities will adhere to CHA standards and during the introductionary session, participants will be introduced to the certifications and the requirements for each learned level.

Riders entering grades four through ten are welcome! In order to insure quality instruction, we keep our camper-to-instructor ratio low. Please register early to reserve your camper's space in our Horseback Skills Camp.
